October 14, Wednesday, Day 1: DEPART FOR GREECE

We depart on an overnight flight from the NYC area airport to Thessaloniki. St. Louis and Los Angeles air quotes are available upon request. Dinner and breakfast will be served on the flight. Quotes for add-on flights from other airports and optional Premium Economy and Business Class upgrades are available upon request and will be quoted starting within 120 days of departure. We work with group airfares (minimum of 10 passengers), which do not permit seat selection. If you wish to reserve specific seats on the flights, we recommend purchasing your own airline tickets and the land-only option with us.

October 15, Thursday, Day 2: ARRIVE THESSALONIKI

Upon landing at Thessaloniki Airport, we proceed through passport control and customs and into the arrival hall, where we will be greeted by our English-speaking tour guide and assisted to the motorcoach. Thessaloniki, the second-largest city in Greece, is named after a half-sister of Alexander. The city, located in northern Greece, is also known as Thessaloniki. Paul's first epistle to the Thessalonians, written in the middle of the first century, is his first known letter. His two letters urged the Thessalonian Christians to "live blamelessly" and to refrain from idleness while they waited for the second coming of Christ. We settle into our comfortable hotel for a good night's rest. Mass will be celebrated at the hotel. Dinner and overnight in Thessaloniki. (D)

October 16, Friday, Day 3: KAVALA – PHILIPPI – THESSALONIKI

After breakfast, which is included each morning, we visit the modern port city of Kavala, which was once the ancient city of Neapolis. Paul, Silas, Luke, and Timothy landed in this port when they sailed into Europe. Philippi, our next stop, is where Saint Paul established the first church in Europe. "And from there (He went) to Philippi, which is the leading city of the district of Macedonia and a Roman Colony. We remained in this city some days." (Acts 16:12-18). We celebrate Mass at the site where Saint Paul baptized a woman named Lydia, the first convert to Christianity in Europe. We visit the Roman Forum, where Saint Paul cast out a spirit from a fortune-telling woman. While here, we will view the prison (now in ruins) where Paul and Silas were jailed by the owners of the fortune-tellers. Dinner and overnight in Thessaloniki. (B.D)

October 17, Saturday, Day 4: THESSALONIKI – BEREA – WINE TASTING IN NAOUSSA

Before departing Thessaloniki, we celebrate Mass and see the old city ramparts, including the newly excavated Forum, St. George Church, and the Galerius Arch. Then, continue to Berea to view the ancient synagogue where St. Paul spoke, and the Bema, surrounded by mosaics of St. Paul, including the plaque of scripture regarding the "more noble" church. Continue to Naoussa, famous for the Xinomavro wine, a red grape variety. Enjoy a visit and a wine-tasting session at Kir Yiannis Winery (wine tasting is accompanied by Greek cheese). Dinner and overnight in Kalambaka. (B.D)

October 18, Sunday, Day 5: METEORA MONASTERIES – ATHENS

We begin with our tour of the Meteora Monasteries. Women are expected to wear skirts and a headscarf covering their hair and shoulders when entering Orthodox monasteries and churches. Here, we see the world-famous Byzantine monasteries perched atop steep, gray rock formations. Their history dates back to the 14th century, when monks sought refuge in the caves carved into the cliffside. We stop at an icon-making facility to learn about the art of written icons. Later, we continue to Athens, where we celebrate Mass and then have dinner at leisure to explore Athens on our own in the evening. Overnight in Athens. (B)

October 19, Monday, Day 6: ATHENS – START 4-DAY AEGEAN CRUISE: MYKONOS

Early this morning, we depart for the Port to board our 4-day cruise aboard the Celestyal Discovery. Our first stop will be the island of Mykonos, the most cosmopolitan of the Greek islands, which attracts visitors from around the world. After docking, we transfer to Hora, the island's capital, where we have leisure time to explore the city's narrow, cobbled streets. We pass by chic boutiques, elegant nightclubs, and whitewashed houses to arrive in Alefkandra. This section of Mykonos is known as the "Venice of Mykonos" as the homes with wooden balconies are built on the sea. Historically, these homes were of wealthy merchants and captains. Mass will be celebrated on the ship. We return to the cruise ship for dinner and overnight. (B.L.D)

October 20, Tuesday, Day 7: CRUISE: KUSADASI – EPHESUS (MARY'S HOUSE) – PATMOS

After breakfast on board, we arrive at the lively Turkish port of Kusadasi. We transfer to the small village of Mt. Koressos, where we will celebrate Mass and visit the small stone chapel on the site where the Virgin Mary spent her last days following Christ's crucifixion. We continue to ancient Ephesus and begin our walking tour, which takes us through the most magnificent excavations in the world. The last stop on the walking tour is the Great Theater, with a capacity of 25,000 people, where Saint Paul preached. On the return of our walking tour, we follow the exact route that Mark Anthony and Cleopatra once rode in procession via the Arcadian Way. This main street runs from the Great Theatre to the main city's harbor. We will see the Basilica of Saint John on our return to Kusadasi. In the sixth century, Emperor Justinian erected this structure over the grave of St. John, the Evangelist. Upon arrival in Kusadasi, we enjoy free time to explore independently before returning to the ship. The next stop is Patmos, where we visit the Monastery of Saint John the Theologian. This marvelous structure was built nine hundred years ago and continues to be supported by the walls of a strong fortification. In addition to the stunning main church, which features outstanding frescoes, we will also view the beautiful courtyard, dining room, and bakery. Our tour continues to the small museum, where we view priceless ecclesiastical treasures, including books, manuscripts, mosaics, icons, textiles, vestments, and jewelry. We board the bus to take us to the Monastery and Grotto of the Apocalypse. In this grotto, experience a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to view the site where the Book of Revelation was written. We return to the ship for dinner and overnight. (B.L.D)

October 21, Wednesday, Day 8: CRUISE: RHODES – THE ISLAND OF KNIGHTS OF ST. JOHN

The Island of Rhodes is a mix of Roman and Byzantine architectural styles. Rhodes was one of the most important seafaring and trading centers in the Eastern Mediterranean during ancient times. Conquered in 1309 by the Knights of Saint John of Jerusalem, it is now under the protection of UNESCO. The day is at leisure in Rhodes to explore the city on our own. We can return to the ship for our included lunch or enjoy lunch on our own in town before we celebrate Mass at Santa Maria Catholic Church (a 5-minute walk from the port). (B.L.D)

October 22, Thursday, Day 9: CRUISE: CRETE (HERAKLION) – SANTORINI

Shore excursions for guided visits of Crete may be purchased on the ship. We recommend visiting Heraklion independently or booking a guided tour of the island, including visiting the ancient ruins of the Palace of

Knossos. These ruins were discovered in 1899, and the palace is currently undergoing partial reconstruction. This ancient palace is believed to have been the mythical Labyrinth of King Minos and the seat of ancient Minoan culture. Additionally, it is the site where Saint Paul met the owner and captain of the ship, who warned him of continuing his journey to spread Christianity in Rome. If an optional excursion is not purchased on the ship, then our time in Crete will be at leisure. We return to the ship to sail to the idyllic island of Santorini, widely regarded as the most breathtaking of all the Greek Islands. We disembark via tender upon arrival in Santorini. We take the cable car to visit Thira with its iconic white-washed houses, narrow streets, open-air cafes, and glittering boutiques that cling to steep cliffs. We celebrate Mass at St. John Catholic Church before returning to the ship for our last dinner and overnight on our cruise. (B.L.D)

October 23, Friday, Day 10: CORINTH - ATHENS

After disembarkation, we visit the ancient city of Corinth. Under the shadow of the towering Acropolis, Saint Paul lived in Corinth for two years. While here, Saint Paul felt great grief over how the Gentile Church in Corinth had become. As a result, he was prompted to write four letters, all with the overarching theme of love. In Corinth, we will have the opportunity to view the remains of the first-century shops, the site of Saint Paul's trial by Gallio, the Fountain of Peirene, and the Temple of Apollo. We celebrate Mass at the Steps of St. Paul in Ancient Corinth. Return to Athens for a city tour that includes a visit to the rock that has dominated the Athens panorama for twenty-five centuries, the Acropolis. Ascend to Mars Hill, where Saint Paul spoke to the Athenians about the one and only God (Acts 17:22), and see the ancient Agora, the former public center of Athenian life. Tonight, we enjoy a festive farewell dinner of great Greek food! (B. Special dinner)

October 24, Saturday, Day 11: RETURN TO THE USA

Today marks the end of our pilgrimage. We will say our heartfelt farewells to a journey that will last in our memory forever. We are transferred to the Athens airport for our return flight home. (B)




